  - Annual reports due by January 15, 2021
  - Any budget modifications due by November 16, 2020
- CY 2021 announced in the next 1-2 weeks
  - Total requests exceeded available funding by about \$178,000, so it was a very competitive process

## Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding (CESF)

- Progress reports are required to be submitted by October 15<sup>th</sup> for the following reporting period: January 20, 2020 - September 30, 2020
- Progress reports shall demonstrate progress in the period for which it occurred
- If there was no activity organizations may put "No activity during this period" or "N/A"
- Please use the approved CESF narrative form

## **CESF - Financial Reporting**

- Financial reports are required to be submitted by October 15th for each of the following periods: January-March; April-June; July-September
- Expenditures shall be recorded in the period for which they occurred (e.g., PPE purchased in February submitted with the Jan-March financial report)
- For new DCJS sub-recipients, the Finance Officer email grantsweb@dcjs.virginia.gov to establish a GMIS account

### **CESF - Requests for Funds**

- Requests for reimbursement can be submitted using the current quarter (any request made prior to September 30 use the July-Sept voucher period)
- If your organization had no activity, and has no expenditures, report \$0.00 on the financial reports for the past three quarters
- Prior to disbursement of funds, all conditions and reporting requirements must be approved

### **VOCA Funding Outlook**

- Many unknown factors
- Goals = sustainability & best meeting victims' needs
- Renewed focus on four VOCA priority areas
- Virginia's FFY20 VOCA award = \$42,711,960
  - FFY19 award was \$57,815,818
  - Reduced by approximately 26%



# VOCA Funding Outlook FY22 Funding

- Victims Services Grant Program (VSGP)
  - Anticipate competitive max award of \$500,000 per year (\$400,000 VOCA + \$100,000 local match)
  - Sexual & Domestic Violence Agencies ("Category 3")
     anticipate level funding to FY21 "category 3" amounts
- Victim Witness Grant Program (VWGP)
  - Anticipate level funding to FY21 amounts

- Purpose of Phase 1 is to provide a grant reporting, data collection, and case management system that supports 113 VWGPs
